CLIMATE AND NATURE CONSERVATION

SMART MEASURES ENSURE A SUSTAINABLE WATER SUPPLY

The WaterFoundation is committed to securing the future and protecting resources in the sense of comprehensive and sustainable ecological, economic and social development. The necessity of thinking about water supply and nature conservation in combination has also been reflected in the addition to our statutes since the summer of 2023: "The foundation promotes nature, environmental and climate protection." Three recent projects in our focus countries Peru, Ethiopia and Bolivia are vivid examples of the successful implementation of this comprehensive approach.

PERU: Vegetation is recovering

To combat the water shortage in the Peruvian highlands, we have been working with Caritas Abancay and the local population since November 2021 to establish three large REPANAS protected areas at an altitude of 3000 meters. With great success! Where cattle used to graze, grasses and bushes are

growing again after just one year. The digging of seepage trenches and tree planting campaigns are also having an effect: 23,350 trees are now helping to ensure that the vegetation is visibly regenerating and that the soil can absorb more water again, benefiting a total of 1,850 people.

The farming families also received 10.5 kg of seeds each: seeds for onions, cabbage, lettuce, carrots, and chard. In the course of the project, 149 families have planted 7.25 hectares of home gardens. The main goal is to achieve a healthier and more diverse diet for the families. In addition, "surplus" vegetables can be sold. The income is used to buy new seeds.

ETHIOPIA: Measures against climate change

In Ethiopia, people also have to struggle with water scarcity. Around 9,000 people in Dirre Inchini depend on unsafe water sources. 30 percent of these sources run dry during the dry season. This is because the water table is falling. One of the reasons for this is that tree cover in the hilly regions has been reduced from 100 to 25 percent due to overgrazing. One of the key measures is therefore to plant around 500,000 trees in fenced-off protected areas by the end of the project in 2025. 400,000 had been planted by September 2024. The aim is to restore natural habitats through a combination of reforestation as well as soil and water protection measures. Two of the three planned

spring developments and water supply systems were completed by our partner EDA-E in 2024. To promote environmentally friendly income opportunities such as beekeeping, fruit and bamboo cultivation, 54 cooperatives have been set up, in which around 1,400 people are organized and receive appropriate training.

BOLIVIA: Afforestation and resource conservation in the Amazon region The new project 'Change through forest and water' started in the Bolivian Amazon region in August 2024. The project, which will run until September 2026, includes large-scale afforestation activities and the establishment of water protection areas in the buffer zone of the Amboró National Park. Four thousand people in 12 communities will benefit directly and a further 76,500 people in surrounding districts indirectly from the improvements in

water quality and quantity. In addition, together with our partner ICO we are making an important contribution to protecting the Amazon rainforest and combating climate change worldwide.



ETHIOPIA SCHORNDORF DONATES 15 DONKEYS

At the second water awareness day of the Rotary Club of Schorndorf, around 120 third-graders learned how precious water is on the circuit in the city park. The water awareness day vividly demonstrates how arduous it is for children and women in Ethiopia to fetch water. The aim of the "water run", including a quiz, is to collect as many donations as possible for water transport donkeys in Ethiopia, which the WaterFoundation regularly distributes to needy women and their families there. A water donkey with a carrying frame and water canisters can be financed with as little as 175 euros.



Susanne John, public relations officer at the WaterFoundation, supervised one of the stations and took the opportunity to personally thank all the primary school children, who were eager to learn and enthusiastic about the subject. The Rotarians converted the children's efforts into a further donation to the WaterFoundation, which will enable the purchase of 15 water donkeys. As always, the highlight of the event were the four tame donkeys, which led by the children – took over the task of carrying water for the children at the end. A noticeable relief – for the children in Schorndorf and for the women in Ethiopia.

ETHIOPIA CLEAN WATER FOR PEACE AND DEVELOPMENT

The war in Ethiopia has had devastating consequences for Tigray. Most of the water supply systems have been destroyed. People and animals have to get their water from open, unprotected sources that are contaminated. The need is great and help is urgently needed. Therefore, the WaterFoundation plans to rebuild a reliable water supply for 200,000 people in 13 rural woredas in Tigray, where transitional aid is not effective, with the support of local authorities and civil society, and to strengthen village communities in their management of water resources. The planned measures include: the repair and restoration of 550 wells, WASH workshops, capacity building for 13 local authorities, the establishment of water committees, training in maintenance and repairs, and the reintroduction of a running fund for spare parts.

Together with our German partner well:fair, we want to show that cooperation for a common goal can be implemented.

ETHIOPIA TOILET FACILITIES INAUGURATED

Due to the tense political situation, the four toilet blocks with 68 hand washing facilities for 5,000 students and teachers at two schools in Bilaa, which were completed late in April 2024, could not be inaugurated until May 2025. Before-

hand, the children were taught important basics of health care and hygiene in numerous WASH workshops. They then created large murals illustrating how to wash their hands and use the toilets properly. Our local partner EDA-E worked under particularly difficult conditions. He can now be all the more proud of what they have achieved.

ETHIOPIA GETTING STRONGER TOGETHER

This project, launched in August 2023, aims to improve the quality of life in rural Ethiopia by setting up self-help groups for women and providing access to clean water. The first workshops for the self-help groups, with a total of 460 women, took place at the end of 2023 and covered topics such

as basic business skills – as a basis for three income-generating measures: the production and sale of cooking stoves, small animal husbandry and vegetable growing. In the case of the energy- and wood-saving cooking stoves, female multipliers are trained according to the train-the-trainer model, and then pass on their knowledge. In the meantime, the groups are now in a position to generate their first income. In addition, all four water collection

points will be completed by the end of 2024 by our project partner Facilitator for Change. 200 donkeys for water transport have already been distributed to the women.

ETHIOPIA PUMP REPAIR ENSURES CLIMATE PROTECTION

The project area in the South Gondar zone suffers from climate-related weather extremes. It is affected by both prolonged droughts and flooding. Such flooding often contaminates water sources with harmful germs. As a result, 67 percent of households there report that they boil water before using it. With serious consequences for the tree population in a country where 88 percent of the energy needs of rural households are covered by wood. The WaterFoundation plans to repair 200 defective water pumps in the five districts where a good 60,000 people

live. This prevents further deforestation of the tree population – an important contribution to the stabilization of natural resources. A WASH research project, which is part of the project and runs until 2026, is investigating the extent to which the desired climate resilience is being achieved. Despite adverse political circumstances, our project partner Vita so far has already repaired almost half of the 200 pumps that were identified as needing repair.

PUMP REPAIR AT SCHOOLS

In Tanzania, about 30,000 water points are not functional. In certain regions, 30 to 50 percent of the water sources are unusable. While a lot of money has been invested in new water systems in the past, it is often forgotten that follow-up repairs are necessary over the years to maintain operation. This is a particularly big problem in schools. Without functioning water access, there is not enough to drink and personal hygiene is limited. Often, children are assigned to carry water, which means they cannot attend classes.

Together with its project partner MSABI, the WaterFoundation has already repaired defective pumps at 13 schools and in 8 villages in the summer of 2023, providing 10,000 people with access to clean water. Because the pilot project was a great success, a second round of the "Pump for Life" (P4L) project started in October 2024. This time, 50 primary and secondary schools are benefiting. In addition to 20,000 children, mechanics (50 percent women) are also benefiting, as they are being trained as part of the project. A maintenance service subscription guarantees the sustainable functionality of the water supply for a small fee.

DRINKING WATER FOR PROFAM IN PERU

Good news comes from the project launched in November 2023: All CloudFishers have now been installed on the barren hills near Lima. The 200-meter-long water pipes were also laid down to Profam in 2024. Now the water collected by the fog collectors supplies the people in the dust-dry suburb of Lima. Before they had to rely on expensive drinking water delivered by tanker. Now they can even create and water small home gardens. The vegetables grown provide healthier nutrition for the disadvantaged population. And surpluses can be sold at the market. We thank our local partner APRODES.

CLOUDFISHER AWARDED

In May 2024, the WaterFoundation received the unendowed Award for Sustainable Development from the German Association for Hot-Dip Galvanizing. The award was accepted by the Chair of the WaterFoundation, Dr. Beate Grotehans, in Cologne. The award was presented at the industry event FEUERVERZINKEN 2024, which attracted 200 participants from industry, politics and science. She used her acceptance speech to inform the audience about the work of the foundation and to solicit support - with success. During the subsequent fundraising event, 22,337.48 euros were collected for CloudFisher projects.

CLOUDFISHER WATERFOUNDATION IN MARBURG

Alongside climate change, the global water crisis is one of the greatest challenges of our time. Creative approaches are needed to deal with the consequences of the water crisis,



particularly in the Global South. That is why the WELTLADEN in Marburg invited the WaterFoundation to present the technology of fog collectors as part of its series of events "Water in times of the climate crisis". In his presentation, Project Manager Luca Wesel explained the function and benefits of the CloudFisher and answered numerous questions from the interested audience.

EXHIBITIONS IN HAMBURG AND ZURICH

From a design perspective, exhibitions in Hamburg and Zurich are looking at the WaterFoundation's CloudFisher. A sample of the fog nets and a film about their use in Morocco were on display from March to October 2024 as part of the exhibition "Water Pressure. Designing for the Future" at the Hamburg Museum für Kunst und Gewerbe. The exhibition, which presents innovative and sustainable design solutions for challenges such as water scarcity or water pollution, can then be seen in Zurich. The Museum für Gestaltung will be showing the diverse exhibits there from November 29, 2024 to April 6, 2025. In 2025, the exhibition will then make a stop in Vienna.
